"AND"

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20)

Dr. Michael Adam Beck writes in the forward to the book, "Both/And" by Jason Moore: "We are living in a Great Commission moment. Moore's book opens by grounding it in a Biblical passage that has historically been central to the Church's fundamental purpose in the world. In essence, Jason picks up where Matthew leaves off, with Jesus' closing commission.

In that final post-resurrection appearance, Jesus stands on a Galilea mountain in all his glorious, wound-bearing, death conquering fullness, and sends the disciples out to be a continuation of his own life in the world. He authorizes and sends them, instructing them that as they go along the journey of life, they should make disciples, little mini-Christ's, who live, walk, talk, and love like Jesus. This commission is global in scope, encompassing all peoples and the entire world. It will require them to cross boundaries, geographic, political, cultural, and religious.

This is what those first disciples did. They left the sense of comfort and familiarity behind. Courageously, they moved into places they had never even dreamed of before. They learned new customs,

new languages, new ways of communicating, new ways of forming community, and new ways to worship. In many cases they experienced rejection and resistance, from both inside the community, and outside of it.

From that time until now, Christians have been crossing boundaries, sharing the gospel, and exploring new forms to worship the living God.



In every generation, time, and place, followers of Jesus must find faithful ways to do this. Boundary crossing worship takes place in new and ever-changing contexts. In the 21<sup>st</sup> Century, the new boundary to be crossed is a digital one. As Fred Rogers once famously said, 'The space between the television set and the viewer is holy ground. A lot happens – a lot happens – there.' Indeed, what if the space between our screens is holy ground? What if we find ourselves on a new missional frontier, in a Great Commission moment?

We live in a time coined 'The Digital Age,' This has not only revolutionized how we communicate; it has changed how human beings think, work, fall in love, live, and worship.

When we went through our Healthy Church Initiative (HCI) process, we concluded that we needed a "Third Place" to reach out to others. During the past two years, we have realized that we must now see the Online Space as a new kind of "third place". Thus, the Digital Campus has evolved.

Beck continues "The forms of Christian worship have been changing ever since that first group of disciples descended that mountain in Galilee and started crossing boundaries. The forms of the church will continue to change, as the gospel takes on flesh, and moves into the neighborhood (John 1). This is true whether we are talking good old fashioned, cell swapping, molecule exchanging, face to face, flesh, and blood community that 'makes our joy complete' (2 John 12). Or the fresh exchange of pixels and distanced contact mediated through the multitude of digital flows in bits and bytes. Real people gather there too. For real community. And real worship.

On this new missional frontier, we will need to be a blended ecology of worship. Worship that is 'gathered AND scattered,' 'centered AND dispersed,' 'attractional AND missional,' 'digital AND analog,' 'onsite AND online.' The key word for Jason, is the genius of 'AND' and he will advocate here for diverse modes of worship living together in a synergistic way. This both/and way allows us to rethink how we carry out the Great Commission. It provides us a fresh vision for how Hubbard Church can be about our boundary crossing mission. Ultimately, it shows us how we can reach new people and invite them into a journey of following Jesus. So, get ready for an exciting journey onto a new missional frontier!"

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Richard Anderson.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: The February minutes were accepted as presented.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> Pastor Lauren reported that our worship attendance both live and online is good and she wants to thank everyone who helped with the Holy Week services.

<u>Digital Campus/UWF</u>: Marion Hansen reported that they have completed the Lord's Prayer Study and will be starting a study on Women in Jail. They have a new Logo- Watch for it. United Women in Faith will be serving fellowship time on Easter Sunday.

Finance Report: Noel Moore reported that we had Operating Income for March, 2022 of \$32,770.18 and Operating Expenses for March of \$16,824.72. This gives us Net Income of \$15,945.46 for March. Our year to date Operating Income is \$147,533.53 with year-to-date Operating Expenses of \$121,337.00 leaving us with a Net Income of \$26,196.53. Joanne Torfin reported that the pledges are coming in well. The Discretionary offerings for March and April totaled \$26,813 for UMCOR-Ukraine, \$5,125 for the Food Shelf and \$2,085 for the Pastor's Discretionary fund. Joanne Torfin made a motion, seconded by Arnie Kuhn to authorize John Kisser, Richard Perrine and Noel Moore to be authorized signatures for the church bank accounts and the safe deposit box at Northview Bank. The motion passed.

Richard Anderson and Margi Taggert are looking into our committee structure and will make recommendations. Pastor suggested an article on One Board Governance.

#### **COVID Boosters**

As with vaccines for other diseases, people are best protected against COVID infection when they stay up-to-date with vaccinations. "Up-to-date" means you have

received your primary vaccine series and all boosters that you are eligible to receive.

COVID vaccines continue to protect people from getting seriously ill, being hospitalized, and even dying—especially people who have received a booster. The Centers for Disease Prevention and Control (CDC) recommends everyone ages 12 years and older receive a COVID vaccine booster after completing their primary COVID vaccination series.

On March 29, 2022, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) authorized a second COVID booster. The second booster must be an mRNA vaccine (either Pfizer or Moderna). Pfizer or Moderna boosters can be administered regardless of which COVID vaccine was previously received. The following individuals are approved for a second booster if it has been at least 4 months since their first booster was administered:

- -Adults 50 years of age and older
- -Immunocompromised individuals

# Living with the Pandemic: Minnesota and Hubbard County COVID-19 Activity

Hubbard County had a total of 42 reported COVID cases in March. This likely represents fewer cases than actual due to the prevalence of home tests. April new reported cases in Hubbard County through 4/21/22 are at 24. Hubbard County COVID positivity rate is up from this time last month.


