Life involves lots of waiting. We wait in groups, in lines, in cars. We wait for packages, for the bus, for the sun to rise. We wait in doctors' offices, at the post office, at the DMV. Waiting implies we're at someone else's mercy, but it's also usually linked to hope. Perhaps that's why Paul Tillich called waiting a metaphor for faith. Why would one wait if there weren't the firm belief that the object of one's wait will eventually materialize?

Waiting can be enervating, which is why Isaiah 40:31 is so promising: "They who wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength." Yet waiting is tough if you have nothing to do while waiting. That's why Jesus, when talking about waiting, also talked about working — work for the night is coming.

Sometimes it's less tiring to work than it is to wait.

There's a lot of waiting during Lent. You're waiting for a payoff. You're waiting for the Resurrection. You're waiting for spiritual growth. And then you realize this isn't waiting at all. It's life. It's joy. It's opportunity. It's blessing.



Choir sings: 1st & 3rd Sundays with rehearsals the week before on Wed. night at 7pm and Sun. morning at 8am.





### What is Ordinary Time??



The Christian year includes two central cycles focused on major events in the life of Christ: the Christmas cycle (Advent-Christmas -Epiphany) and Easter cycle (Lent-Easter-Pentecost). Each of these seasons begins with a time of preparation and anticipation followed by a time of celebration.

A season designated as Ordinary Time follows each cycle. The word "ordinary" here does not mean "routine" or "not special." Instead, it refers to the "ordinal numbers" (first Sunday, second Sunday, third, etc.) The first period of Ordinary Time, called the Season after Epiphany, begins on Epiphany Day and ends on the day before Ash Wednesday (the beginning of Lent).

The second period of Ordinary Time, the Season after Pentecost, follows the Easter cycle. Every year, Christians experience the contrast between the central seasons of Christmas and Easter, where we see God in the events around the coming of Christ, and the in-between times, where we see, speak about and join God's ongoing work in the world.

We thus experience two regular cycles of preparation, celebration and action in ministry each year.



### Remembering 9/11: The Pentagon Quilts

Love and memories we impart, To quilt the fabric of the heart.

Several weeks ago our granddaughter, Sara, a member of the US Air Force, invited us for a tour and lunch at the Pentagon, where she works as a Cyber Officer.

Imagine my surprise when we entered one of the corridors (there are 17 miles of corridors in the Pentagon) and discovered a display of 50 commemorative quilts sent by Americans who wanted to express their feelings after the terrorist attacks of 9/11. The total collection includes more than 100 quilts made by children, civilians, churches, companies, and artists from across the country and world.

Many quilts feature the American flag; one includes

photos of those killed in the Pentagon and on American Airlines Flight 77. The Hearts Across America Quilt, made by children in six states, contains drawings of hearts, patriotic themes, the Twin Towers, the Pentagon and airplanes.



As I walked the corridor, remembering 9/11 and viewing quilts that expressed a collective feeling of sorrow, I was reminded once again of how scraps of fabric, sewn together with love, can create an object of art that heals "those in need of care and comfort," which includes all of us at one time or another.

### The Cup of Grace

What I make with my hands, I give with my heart.

There is an artist at work among us, one who designs and quilts works of art.

Sue Harmon's most recent gift to the church is *The Cup* of *Grace*, a banner that will grace the front of the sanctuary the first Sunday of each month, as the congregation celebrates Holy Communion.

"I began researching communion symbols this past summer, looking for images of chalices that would translate well to fabric," she explained.

"I work with photos of the symbols, moving them around on freezer paper the size of the banner, until I am satisfied with the layout, especially from a distance. Then I look at fabrics to see what colors will look good together. For this banner I used Cherrywood hand-dyed fabric; the colors compliment each other. I then cut the design pieces, sewing them together, and fusing smaller pieces (grapes and wheat) to hold them in place."

Sue quilted the banner (quilting includes three layers top, batting, and back), using her own sewing machine. Her final step was to bind the edges and then add a label that includes the name of the quilt, who made it, and the date.

You may recall seeing other banners that Sue has made for the church, including ones for Lent, Pentecost, Advent, and now, Communion. She also designed and quilted the sunflower banner honoring Ukraine, and a banner for the Breakthrough Renewal Institutes hosted by HUMC in 2017 and 2019.

Sue has nearly 40 years experience as a quilt teacher, shop owner, lecturer, quilt historian, and certified appraiser. Knowledgeable in quilt history, care and restoration, she has a collection of more than 100 quilts, one dating back to 1840.

You can find her almost every Tuesday in the Fellowship Hall, helping the Threads of Love Quilter make quilts for those in need of care and comfort. She would be happy to talk to you about her love of quilting!
