No Ordinary Time

Dear Church Family,



As I write this, Easter has passed, and we are in the season known as Eastertide. We celebrate this season for the 50 days following Christ's resurrection until the day of Pentecost on May 28th.

Pentecost is from the Greek word for "fiftieth day." It was the Greek name for the Hebrew Feast of Weeks, which fell 50 days after Passover. The Feast of Weeks celebrated the calling of the Hebrews into a covenant relationship with God at Mt. Sinai.

Following Pentecost, we enter into our summer season, and the liturgical season of "Ordinary Time." The word "ordinary" here does not mean "common, normal, or unimportant." The word is originated from the Latin word "ordinalis," meaning "ordered" or "number in a series." That means the Ordinary Time represents the ordered life of the Church – to support new disciples and the whole congregation in living out the gifts and callings discerned during the Easter Season and commissioned on the Day of Pentecost.

You might know the liturgical color for Ordinary Time. It's Green! Green is not just an ordinary color. It tells us that it is time to spread seeds. It speaks that it's time to grow, and it shows us various lives and fruits! The summer season of Ordinary Time is time to grow in faith, accept diverse gifts from God, and share and spread fruit – the good news to one another.

Do you remember what happened on the night of Pentecost? Acts 2 describes that when Jesus' followers gathered in one place in Jerusalem, a powerful wind, and tongues of fire as the Holy Spirit was poured out on them. They were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages that they hadn't learned before. At that time, people from all round the world came to Jerusalem to celebrate a Jewish feast. The tourists were amazed at the people who speak other languages. Because they heard Jesus' followers speaking in the native language of each. What a miracle!

But the miracle has more meaning in it. At the time, their official language was Greek, which was the language of the Romans, who ruled over Israel. The language also meant majority and privilege. But the Holy Spirit let them speak in other languages. And people heard it clearly not only with their ears but also with their hearts. It was the moment that the majority's hierarchical and exclusive nature broke down. It was the moment of creating welcoming space for all.

The 2023 Minnesota Annual Conference will be held in St. Cloud on May 31 - June 1. The theme of this year's conference is "Encounter. Transform. Respond. The Emmaus Experience" It is based on Luke 24:13-35 and ties in perfectly with our entire Lenten and Easter series as we heard how Jesus lifts up the lowly and opens our hearts to how we can continue Christ's work in this world as the beloved community.

As the beloved community, we celebrate our diversity and unique gifts from one another; and we lament some parts of our denominational body that may choose to leave because of the different theological perspectives over the next year as we ready ourselves for the upcoming General Conference next Spring.

As the beloved community, we face that our siblings have been harmed on the basis of their sex, gender, sexual orientation, race, and color and we challenge ourselves to confront discrimination and harm.

Envisioning a beloved community is not an easy task. For that, we *should* speak in other languages – languages of people who are minorities, who have been misunderstood, mistreated, and harmed because of their uniqueness. When we speak in their languages, we can hear from each other, reach to the bottom of our hearts, and finally share our hearts.

At annual conference this May, Bishop Lanette Plambeck, no doubt, will emphasize that our gathering together is considered holy conferencing. At each meeting with churches and districts, our bishops and district superintendents encourage us to have holy conversation. To consider all who are gathered as a precious child of God no matter what, and to give up our own assumptions and experiences in order to open our hearts to listen to others' voices carefully, and invite the Holy Spirit to lead one's way of speaking and thinking.

It must be truly a way of speaking in other languages that each one may hear the good news of God from one another. Then, we may enjoy our richness together – the diverse gift that we are given by God as we look ahead to Ordinary Time.

I look forward to sharing with you what we have learned at this year's annual conference. Please keep our Lay Delegate, John Kisser, our Lay Leader, Marion Hansen, and your Pastor in your prayers as we travel to St. Cloud this coming May.

May your Spring and Summer be blessed as we welcome back our beloved snowbirds!

Blessing of Quilts May 21

"Beautiful things come together one stitch at a time."

The Threads of Love Quilters annual "Blessing of the Quilts" will be held during the morning worship service on Sunday, June 4th, with colorful quilts and fleece blankets on display in the sanctuary.

"This mission project—making quilts for those in need of care and comfort—is an important part of HUMC's outreach to the congregation and to our local community," explained Sue Harmon, coordinator of the quilting group. Following the service, the quilts and fleece blankets will be bundled for distribution to local schools and organizations, with some held in reserve for distribution during the summer months.

"We would like to thank those who have so generously supported the quilters with financial gifts during the past year," said Diane Thoelke, treasurer. "These gifts have made it possible for us to purchase the material and fleece (always on sale!), necessary in the making of this year's more than 100 quilts and blankets."

Currently, the quilters are cutting and sandwiching a number of fleece blankets, in hopes that members of the congregation will take one home to tie the fringe (very simple!) and then return the finished blanket to the church. These blankets will be distributed to two area schools in October.

The Hubbard quilting group has been invited to participate in a Quilt Show & Demonstration, sponsored by the Hubbard County Historical Museum and scheduled to be held at Riverside United Methodist Church, on July 22.

The quilters' end-of-the year-end luncheon will be held Tuesday, June 6. All quilters, past and present, and those interested in joining this group, are invited to attend. Stay tuned for further details.

The quilters meet every Tuesday beginning at 9:30 am in the Fellowship Hall. New members are always welcome.

Our lives are like quilts – bits and pieces, joy and sorrow, stitched with love.

Did you know???

Hubbard Church has various sources in which we reach others through our in-person worship as well as through our online sources. We would like to highlight some of these statistics for you from the past **90 days**:

Who are we reaching as we worship each week? We reach others in person and online:

Our IN PERSON average weekly attendance has been: 46

Our **ONLINE** average weekly attendance has been: **151**Our **TOTAL** average weekly attendance from January - Easter has

been: 197

How do we reach them?

We reach others through our Website:

189 Users have utilized our Website to watch our Worship Services via the Livestream, Worship and Online Video pages.

59% are watching through their computer, 39% from their mobile phone, and 2% from a tablet.

40% are organically searching, 14% arrive through Facebook, 44% are a direct search for HUMC, and 2% are referred to us by others.

We reach others through our YouTube Channel

There are 188 subscribers to our YouTube Channel. (in Sept. 2019 there were only 15!)

82% are new viewers vs. return visitors.

78% watch the live stream vs. uploaded videos.

74% of the people who watch are not subscribed!

The average retention rate varies from 11 minutes to 58 minutes. (Depending on the service)

20% of the viewers use closed captioning

We reach others through our Facebook page

We have 273 Followers on our Facebook page.

We have had 1150 Visits to our Page in the last 90 days, reaching 3108 people. (up 245% from the past 90 days!)

75% of our followers are women.

76% are age 55+ and of that 76%, 55% are 65+

We are being watched from: the US, South Africa, Ghana, India,

Liberia, Mexico, Thailand, Philippines, and Tanzania... to name a few!

We will work to retain subscribers, retention rates, and overall viewership online.

We will invite, invite, invite others to join us both in person and online.

We will encourage you to share our posts! Share our website! Share our Message!

We will continue to invite volunteers to help with our online messaging as well as to work in our Tech booth.
