# "And the Word became flesh and dwelled among us." John 1:14

"Surprise, surprise, surprise!" - the immortal words of Gomer Pyle

In the package of a goofy, beloved character, there was an amazing surprise. Johnny Carson discovered it and revealed it to the world on his program. Jim Nabors was invited to sing on Johnny's show. When he opened his mouth to sing the whole listening audience was surprised and amazed.






# Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service Nov. 22, 7:00pm at HUMC

# Analytics Report October 2023

#### Website

Over the past 90 days, our website has received a total of 412 visitors, a 6% decrease from the previous 90 days. 45% of these visitors are organic (coming from google searches) and 48% of them are direct (link pasted directly into the search bar, like a bookmark or a saved link). Our unique visitor count is 184, down 3% from the previous 90 days. While some of these statistics are slightly down, more people are visiting our site after seeing it pop up in their search results. From a total of 4.6K impressions, 156 people click to visit our site, a 5%

increase from the previous 90 days. Another thing to note is that our homepage has a 64% increase in clicks and a 17% increase in engagement, meaning more people are spending more time on the homepage than any other page.

#### YouTube

Over the past 90 days, we have received over 1.8K channel views, a 38% increase from our previous 90 days! We also have a watchtime of over 280 hours, an increase by 65%, and have gained 7 new subscribers! We have reached a total of 775 new viewers for our livestreams and have a whopping 31K content impressions! From these impressions, 854 people have decided to check us out and have an average view duration of 11 minutes. One way we can increase the clicks from impressions is by creating interesting thumbnails. Thumbnails are what causes a person to really take interest in the video and are a huge part of how a viewer decides what to watch. If we work on creating better thumbnails, we could potentially have a large increase in viewers from YouTube's recommendation system. Our top videos for the past 90 days are the

#### Facebook and Instagram

During the past 90 days, our Facebook reach has dropped 40% to 1,225 people. While this may seem shocking, our facebook profile visits is at 1,281 people, a 27% increase in visitors. Facebook has recommended our content to less people than who actually visit our page. That means that while Facebook recommending our content to others has dropped, more and more people are either revisiting our page after the first view or connecting to us using an outside link. Also, there has been a 65% increase in engagement with our audience, so while our reach has dropped, our community has become more active and willing to interact with our page and with each other. With our instagram, we have gained 8 followers (a total of 12 overall followers now) and reached 125 people over the past 90 days. Almost all of these impressions happened in one video, so short videos might be the better option for instagram than daily posts. Since the instagram account is so new, experimenting with different types of content will lead to the best outcome for interacting with more people,

#### Tik Tok

Tik Tok is a social media platform that consists of short videos delivered one at a time to a user. If the user does not want to watch a certain video that is played, they scroll down and a different video is played for them. Instead of choosing which video to watch next like YouTube, Tik-Tok's algorithm picks what video to play based on the user's amount of time spent on certain types of videos and engagement with those videos.

Since the creation of our TikTok account we have uploaded 1 video, gained 2 followers, and reached 220 people. There is a large potential for growth and the exciting prospect of reaching a new audience through this platform. Our church can spread the love of God online where we previously could not, and by using these modern tools we can touch the lives of people who would previously have no contact with us or our congregation.
