#### Northern Voice Newsletter Spring (Feb-Mar-Apr) 2024 "Go into all the World and Preach the Gospel." ~Mark 16:15

I'm often asked about the difference between a traditional brickand-mortar church and an online church. Prior to Covid-19, this was not the question that people were asking me—so I feel blessed to have been in the unique position of having been a part of both worlds. While I initially expected a lot of differences, I was surprised by what I learned: the only thing that changes is the shape of the lobby.

That's right. The lobby just looks different. Because, no matter where people gather, in church buildings or online, the same *opportunities* for ministry still exist. People still need relational connection. They still need prayer. They still need someone to support them through difficult seasons, encourage them through seasons of growth, and celebrate with them at the mountaintop moments. At Hubbard Church, we are trying to create a space both in person and online where people feel welcome. We have greeters, we have people available for prayer, and we offer community to those looking for a place to belong. Even though the method might be different, our calling is still the same.

Jesus tells us, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel." He tells us "what" to do, but much of the "how" is up to us. I think of the good shepherd who leaves the 99 sheep to go after the one that's lost. Technology is such a big part of our everyday lives— even more so during the current crisis—that it's easier and easier to use it to chase after the one. We don't have to wait for the lost to come to us. We can meet them exactly where they are.

It's not a question of whether we here at Hubbard can reach people with technology; we can. The question is whether we can get past our preconceived notions, concerns, or fears and embrace technology to reach people.

I believe online church is a ministry opportunity we need to continue to explore both now and in the future. And here are some of the reasons why:


The internet does not limit God. Just because everyone doesn't meet in our physical location, doesn't mean we can't experience God together. With the addition of Andy Hendrickson, our Digital Host and our online group studies, we are able to interact with

2) We can shine light into even the darkest corners of the internet. In this world, people are constantly told they're not enough. That message only seems to get louder online through bullying, unrealistic body images, and negativity of all varieties. The body of Christ has the opportunity to step into that same space with a counter-culture message and offer people the grace, hope, peace, and love they're craving. We can be a source of encouragement and light the digital world desperately needs.

- **3. Problems don't wait for Sunday.** People are broken and hurting around the world, ever day of the week. Technology creates the opportunity to bridge the gap between weekends so that if someone wants to turn to the church for help, they have a place to go. Hubbard Church uses our Website, Facebook, Instagram, TikTok, YouTube, and email to minister throughout the week. Using the technology available to us, we can pray with someone halfway around the country who might be battling with their depression and needs to talk to someone who cares. We can meet people online to support them in their greatest moment of need.
- 4. Anonymity breaks down walls. Critics of online ministry often say accountability is missing in an environment where people can hide behind anonymity. But at Hubbard, we have found that oftentimes people will share more openly online than they might in face-to-face conversations. Online attendees have commented that they were often too hesitant to attend a traditional church setting, worried about what people might say or think. But they feel comfortable enough to attend online, and when they did, they find a place to belong.
- 5. Genuine relationships can form online. A common misconception about online relationships is that they aren't as powerful or real as the relationships we form in person. But think of how many marriages today start as online relationships. Think of children who regularly connect with their grandparents through FaceTime... Clearly, technology can be a powerful too for bringing people together. At Hubbard, we strive to connect people to each other because we believe spiritual growth best happens in the context of community. We encourage our online community to deepen relationships, both within the service and outside the service.

- 6) We can be together in mission. Not everyone can go on a mission trip, but you don't have to travel to minister to people around the world. We can reach into places from Hubbard to across our state into Ogilvie, MN and across our country to Florida and Arizona, as well as into Canada, Norway, and Africa, just to name a few! We can minister in places where it's unsafe for people to gather as a church offering a place for them to use their Spiritual gifts for the Kingdom of God.
- Friends, at Hubbard Church, we believe God has called us to use the technology available to us in this time and in this place, to spread the Good News to as many people as we can in as many places that we can. There are more than eight billion people on this earth, and as long as there is one hurting person who doesn't know the love of Christ, we know our job isn't done.
- As we look forward into the future, let us also look back over the past year and see how many people we have impacted with our weekly worship alone. Thank you to all of you who support this remarkable ministry opportunity here at Hubbard Church!


#### Camp Scholarships needed!

For all who wish to join us, HUMC choir would love to have you sing with us!







You are invited! A World Day of Prayer event will be hosted at Crystalbrook apartments on

Who knew what you can do with a scrap of this and a crumb of that!

Just take a look at the photo (below) and you will see what is termed in quilting vernacular as a *Crumb Block Quilt.* Mary Takle and Beth Holland put this quilt together to illustrate what happens when you dump your fabric scraps (crumbs) on the table, sew them together in any random way, cut and trim this "new fabric" into blocks, then sew them together create a beautiful, colorful quilt.
